

GENERAL INFORMATION

- ◆ Quilts will be judged and receive written comments from the judge.
- ◆ Ribbons will be awarded in each judged category.
- ◆ The Quilt Show Committee reserves the right to merge categories with less than 7 entrants, re-categorize entries, not to award all ribbons, and to not display any quilt or garment deemed inappropriate for the show.
- ◆ Items previously entered in a prior Star Quilters Guild Show are not eligible.
- ◆ The show sponsors cannot be held responsible in case of loss or damage. The display area will be locked at night with a security guard on duty; volunteers will be on duty during show hours.
- ◆ All entrants agree to abide by the rules as stated below.

RULES OF ENTRY

- ◆ Each entry must be three layers with a minimum of 50% quilted.
- ◆ Enter as many quilts as you would like.
- ◆ A separate entry form must be used for each entry. Photocopies are acceptable.
- ◆ Each quilt must be finished with a 4" sleeve on back for hanging (2" for miniatures).
- ◆ Each quilt must have a clearly readable label on the back to identify the quilt owner.
- ◆ Completed quilt show registrations must be received by February 6, 2017. Form on back.
- ◆ Entry fee is \$5 per quilt for non-members of the Star Quilters Guild. Write checks payable to Star Quilters Guild.
- ◆ QUILT CHECK-IN: Check-in will be Wednesday, March 22, at the Berglund Center between 8 am and 2 pm. If you are unable to personally bring your quilt, a friend may do so for you. Each quilt will receive a receipt that will be needed for pick-up after the show.
- ◆ QUILT PICK-UP: Quilts are to be picked up Saturday, March 25, between 5 and 6 pm. The Exhibit Hall will be closed between 4 and 5 pm to allow Show Committee to take down, fold, and organize quilts. Bring receipt received at check-in for each entry to claim quilt(s).

JUDGE: Priscilla B. Godfrey

A native of New York state, Priscilla graduated from Muskingum College with a degree in English and Theatre. She began quilting in 1978 and exhibited her first quilt, a baby quilt, in the 1979 National Quilting Association (NQA) Show in Washington, DC, receiving an honorable mention. She earned her quilt judge certification from NQA in 1986. She has judged NQA Shows, served as the Certified Quilt Judges Quarterly Editor, Chair of the Quilt Judge Certification Program, and Secretary on the NQA Board of Directors. She has recently judged quilt shows throughout the northeast including the Virginia State Fair, Eastern Long Island Quilt Guild Show, West Virginia Culture Center Quilt Show, and Charlotte (NC) Quilters Guild Show.
